Allow me once again to congratulate our matric class of 2025 on their incredible results. We are immensely proud of them and in certain categories their results were the best in the country. Not only did they achieve a 100% pass rate, but the group has an average of 4,2 distinctions per candidate, and 79 learners have six or more distinctions. Where they truly kicked dust in the eyes of other schools was with their 79,4% group average for the 231 learners. The results proved once again that Midstream College is really a school where every learner can perform to the best of his or her ability. Congratulations to Jenhara Rooplall, our Dux learner with 11 distinctions and an incredible 97,1% average. We salute you!

MATRIC RESULTS

The class of 2025 once again produced exceptional results. They achieved a 100% pass rate and the 231 matrics amassed 792 distinctions (4,2 per candidate). 99,6% met the requirements for Bachelor's Degree studies at a university. All the subject averages are comfortably above the IEB national averages.
